Meridian named "Best Galley" in Navy Region Southeast



The galley also received their 15th 5-Star Accreditation and will be competing for the Captain Edward F. Ney Award. The Captain Edward F. Ney Memorial Award, named for the Navy captain who served as the head of the Subsistence Division of the Bureau of Supplies and Accounts from 1940 to 1945, is the highest honor given to U.S. Navy food service operations to recognize food service excellence. The galleys honored must achieve a five-star rating from the Navy evaluation team during an annual evaluation. The award is designed to improve food services by encouraging competition among food service operations.

A Marine Corps legacy to be proud of

On Oct. 12, 2024, Pvt. Zachery Thurber, a Marine with India Company, 3rd Recruit Training Battalion, stood before the Iwo Jima monument on the Peatross Parade Deck, ready to receive his Eagle, Globe, and Anchor from his senior drill instructor. The last person Zachery expected to see was his father, Sgt. Maj. William Thurber (USMC, Ret.), and was shocked beyond belief when he stepped in front of him.

"I had thought of so many things I wanted to say when I saw him," said William. "When I got in front of him, I couldn't remember a single thing." Everyone who earns the title of Marine experiences a transformation like no other. Zachery's was no different. Both Zachery and William needed a moment to recognize each other. "They told me right where he was going to be," said "But still, William. Ι

seriously had to look at his name tapes, I was stunned." "I zoned out, then I blinked and my dad was in front of me," said Zachery. "I was so zoned out I didn't recognize who it was."

William presented Zachery with the Marine Corps emblem he wore on active duty. "Seeing my dad after 12 weeks, and getting his EGA, it was the most surreal feeling," said Zachery. William was so emotional in the moment he could only muster a single phrase. "Because I am retired, this is the only day we will both be in these Cammie's together at the same time," said William.

Zachary said his father was a huge inspiration growing up and is the primary reason he followed in his dad's yellow footsteps. "My whole life I have looked up to my dad," said Zachery. "Indirectly he was one of the biggest influences because he was a Marine."

Zachery was able to adjust his join date so he could be in India Company, his dad's boot camp company. William served the Marine Corps for 32 years, all over

the world, and his son traveled with him. Zachery witnessed the esprit de corps that Marines are known for. "He lived it his whole life, he knew nothing else except the Marine Corps," said William. "He grew up seeing Marines and knew I enjoyed it, and I think that's why he joined."

"All the Marines my dad knew, and the Marines I grew up around, seeing the way they carried themselves just made me want to join more," said Zachery. said he is William proud immensely of Zachery and everything accomplished he recruit training. in

"No help from parents, no last-minute phone calls,' said William. "Everything he did there for the last three months he did on his own." Zachery is incredibly eager and ready to continue the family legacy, but is also ready to forge his own path. "I am really proud to grow up under this name and my dad's legacy," said Zachery. "But I want to build my own legacy, I want to be known as Zachery Thurber, and not Sgt. Maj. William Thurber's son."

On Oct. 25, 2024, William was made the parade reviewing official for his son's graduation ceremony. Just before the final dismissal, William reviewed the company as they marched he got to watch his son march across the same parade deck he did almost 36 years ago.

HSC-26 Embraces History & Heritage Ahead of Veterans Day 2024

Helicopter Sea Combat Squadron (HSC) 26 hosted a former aviator from its predecessor squadron, Helicopter Combat Support Squadron (HC) 6, to walk through squadron history and heritage following the 249th birthday celebration of the U.S. Navy.

Every November, the United States takes a day to honor veterans for their service and sacrifices to their country. As Veteran's Day 2024 approaches, HSC-26 reflects on a recent and unique opportunity to do just that while hosting retired Capt. Pete Lumianski and his wife Chris for a tour of his former squadron.

The couple now reside in Phoenix, Arizona, so the trip was inspired by the opportunity to visit friends and peers from their time in service who they don't often have the option to visit, leading to a short stop in Norfolk to reminisce on Lumianski's early days of service. A U.S. Naval Academy graduate of the class of 1965, Lumianski arrived to his first fleet command, HC-4 Detachment Norfolk, in 1967 following the conclusion of flight school and the pinning of his "Wings of Gold". Shortly after his arrival, the squadron was re-designated as HC-6, meeting various missions with multiple different helicopters. "HC flying was a terrific start to my Navy career. There were three types of choppers on the flight line: H-

34s, H-3s and H-46s, about 30 assigned pilots, many operational missions and lots of optional flying assignment in

"I loved my first operational flving assignment in Norfolk, a squadron with many diverse and odd-ball pilots assigned. The ready room was always a 'Star Wars Bar Scene' look-alike," Lumianski expressed. Lt. Maxwell Gray, a pilot currently assigned to HSC-26, assisted with the visit. Starting off in the ready room, he showed Lumianski and his wife various offices and work centers, maintenance spaces and projects as well as the paraloft, ending the tour with a static display of HSC-26's current helicopter platform, the MH-60S Knighthawk.


