Northeast Cadet Cruises on Navy's Newest Warship

Cadet Lt. Cmdr. Zachary Boyd, of Northeast Lauderdale High School NJROTC, was one of 23 cadets from NJROTC Area 16 recently selected to participate in Tiger Cruise aboard the Navy's newest amphibious dock transport ship, the USS Richard M. McCool Jr.

The McCool, the Navy's newest and most technologically advanced warship, was built by Ingalls Shipyard in Pascagoula. The ship is scheduled to be commissioned this Saturday at Naval Air Station Pensacola in Florida.

"Tiger Cruise is a Navy program that allows non-military members to experience daily operations aboard the ship while it's at sea," said retired Cmdr. Chad West, Northeast's Navy JROTC senior naval science instructor. "This was a truly rare opportunity for NJROTC cadets as it allowed them to see firsthand the things they have learned in the classroom."

Northeast High School is one of 27 schools within the NJROTC Area 16 district, which covers portions of four states and extends from eastern Texas to the panhandle of Florida. Altogether, 20 of the area's 27 schools were represented on the cruise, including Billie Pike, of Neshoba Central High School's NJROTC program.

West said Boyd traveled to Florida Wed., Aug. 28, where he joined the NJROTC Area 16 manager and the other 22 cadets selected for the event. They boarded the ship in Panama City, Florida, on Thursday morning for an

overnight cruise at sea before pulling into port at Naval Air Station Pensacola on Friday, he said. •

Captain's Virtual Suggestion Box: Questions & Answers



Suggestions

Q. I just wanted to point out that there is a dead tree next to the main supply warehouse fenced in outside storage building that has the potential to take out the fence around the storage building as well as most of the covered storage building. This tree is between the NTTC student walkway going to the gym and the fenced in supply storage building.

A. Thank you for bringing this to our attention. We have informed the supply storage team and issued a work order to remove the tree in question, as well as another nearby. We expect this work to be complete by 9 September.

Q. The ants are really bad around base. The playgrounds and picnic tables aren't being taken care of and many kids are getting eaten up.

A. Thank you for bringing this to our attention. The Balfour Beatty

team has gotten to work on this. The playgrounds in the Pine Crest neighborhoods were treated on 9/3/24. The playground in the Juniper Ridge neighborhood (behind Oak Circle) is scheduled to be sprayed next Tuesday, September 10, 2024, following the pressure washing of the tables by the roads and grounds staff. Additionally, the pest control technician will be conducting monthly spray treatments for all playgrounds.

Q. Please repair the golf cart bridges so that we can run distances on the old golf cart paths.

A. These bridges are scheduled for full renovation as part of a Naval Mobile Construction project tentatively Battalion scheduled for February 2025. and reliability Given safety concerns, the old bridges are beyond temporary repairs at this point.

Q. The CDC in-service training days are significantly impactful to the service members working on base. No other site in the US Navy is allowed to close on a non-federal holiday for training of their own personnel. This leaves many people with no options but to take leave or pay exorbitantly for other care (which lacks in the

meridian area). Please consider reduced hours or weekend/ holiday training for the CDC personnel.

A. Thank you for the feedback and we understand the concerns in needing to make alternative childcare arrangements during these times. In 2022, Department of the Navy mandated all CYP's to close three times per calendar year to conduct In-Service training. This mandate further requires In-Service training be scheduled during regular operating hours. These training days have proven to be a valuable tool for our CYPs by providing standardized training and the highest quality service. Like other school systems, these professional training days are intended to enhance the quality of care for children in our program by providing staff with dedicated time to meet mandatory training requirements. At least a 90-day notice will be provided and parent fees are reflective of these planned program closures.

Q. Hello, I would like to know why there is no recycle (cardboard, plastic, aluminum) pick up or large recycle bins available on base or in housing? If it's not used by many, would a company be available to do a large (bulk) recycle bin in

housing? I feel terrible that my Amazon boxes, soda bottles, and cans are being tossed in with the landfill.

A. This remains a high priority for us. Recycling centers for cardboard or paper are scarce in Mississippi, with none available in our service area. This makes recycling very costly. We are actively exploring partnerships with other agencies to reduce costs and begin recycling our cardboard, paper, and metal waste streams more effectively.

Q. The library needs a computerized card catalog system for patrons to search and find books, games, and videos. Also consider publicizing the e-library options.

A. Thank you for the feedback. The library has an online database that can be searched via the link: https://milrec. following bibliovation.com/app/search

The highlight of the trip was the presentation of the Navy JROTC Sea-Cruise award to each cadet by the ship's commanding officer and command master chief. Some of the cadets also received the Ship's Chal-

lenge Coin or the Captain's Challenge Coin.

Named after U.S. Navy officer and Medal of Honor recipient Richard M. McCool Jr., the \$1.4 billion ship is the Navy's 13th San Antonio-class amphibious transport dock ship. The 684-foot-long, 105-foot-wide ship is equipped with an advanced radar system, flight deck and well deck able to be flooded with water for boats to dock within the lower level of the ship. It will be used to transport and land Marines and their equipment and supplies ashore and will be capable of treating most medical needs in an onboard elaborate medical center.


