

ED Form #13 - List of **Authorized, Allowed, and Prohibited** Non-stormwater Discharges on Naval Construction Battalion Center (NCBC) Gulfport (Revised 28 September 2022)

Naval Construction Battalion Center (NCBC) Gulfport installation operates under the Mississippi Department of Environmental Quality (MDEQ) Small Municipal Separate Storm Sewer (MS4) General Permit issued 18 Mar 2016. ACT2 (MS4, Permit Applicability and Coverage) **authorizes the following non-stormwater discharges on the installation** as long as they are not a substantial cause or contributor of pollutants entering the MS4 and do not cause or contribute to a violation of the Mississippi water quality standards (criteria) as set forth in 11 Mississippi Administrative Code Part 6, Chapter 2 and applicable state and federal laws, regulations and criteria:

Water line flushing
Landscape irrigation
Diverted stream flows
Rising ground waters
Uncontaminated ground water infiltration (infiltration is defined as water other than wastewater that enters a storm sewer system, including sewer service connections and foundation drains, from the ground through such means as defective pipes, pipe joints, connections, or manholes. Infiltration does not include, and is distinguished from, inflow.)
Uncontaminated pumped ground water
Discharges from potable water sources
Foundation drains
Air conditioning condensate and coil wash water with no additives
Irrigation water
Springs
Water from crawl space pumps
Footing drains
Lawn watering runoff
Water from individual residential car washing
Flows from riparian habitats and wetlands
Dechlorinated swimming pool discharges
Street wash water
Discharges or flows from firefighting activities
Fire hydrant flushing
External building wash downs which do not use detergents

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<p>MDEQ Small (1 or <5 acres) and Large (5 or > acres) Construction General Permit <u>ALLOWABLE</u> NON-STORM WATER DISCHARGES</p>
Discharges from actual fire-fighting activities
Fire hydrant flushing
Water used to control dust
Potable water sources including uncontaminated water line flushing
Routine external building wash down that does not use detergents
Pavement wash waters where spills or leaks of toxic or hazardous materials have not occurred (unless all spilled material has been removed) and where detergents are not used
Uncontaminated air conditioning or compressor condensate
Uncontaminated ground water or spring water
Foundation or footing drains where flows are not contaminated with process materials such as solvents
Landscaping irrigation
Water used to wash vehicles, wheel wash water and other wash water where detergents are not used
Construction dewatering water discharged in accordance with ACT5, T-11 of Large Construction Stormwater General Permit
<p>MDEQ MS4, Small (1 or <5 acres) and/or Large (5 or > acres) Construction General Permits <u>PROHIBITED</u> NON-STORM WATER DISCHARGES</p>
Wastewater from washout of concrete (unless managed by an appropriate control)
Wastewater from washout and cleanout of stucco, paint, form release oils, curing compounds and other construction materials
Fuels, oils, or other pollutants used in vehicle and equipment operation and maintenance
Soaps or solvents used in vehicle and equipment washing
Wastewater from sanitary facilities, including portable toilets
Contaminated discharge waters from dewatering activities and dewatering activities, including discharges from dewatering trenches and excavations unless managed by best management practices (BMPs).
Toxic or hazardous substances from a spill or other release
