Subj: OPERATIONAL STRESS CONTROL POLICY

- 1. In accordance with references (a) and (b), U.S. Naval Station, Guantanamo Bay, Cuba has reviewed all requirements and implemented the following actions:
- a. The My Navy Family Application has been advertised in all Welcome Aboard Letters along with the Ombudsman's contact information to assist Navy families during a Permanent Change of Station.
- b. Command Indoctrination has been modified to include an introduction to the Command Resilience Team (CRT), its functions, and the essential role of deck-plate leadership.
- c. A list of organic resources (command-provided) an inorganic resources (provided external to the command form both Navy and Non-Navy sources) has been posted in a common area to aid in connecting service members, civilians and their families with support services.
- d. The Command Sponsor Coordinator and Command Indoctrination Coordinator have been added as permanent members of the CRT.
